## **MINUTES**

**President:** The time is 11:04 am and I understand that we have reached quorum to commence the meeting today. Before I proceed, I will hand over the mike to the secretary in order to proceed with the agenda thank you.

**Smt. Buljeet Kaur (Hon. Secretary):** Thank you Mr. President and a very good morning to all our esteemed SSU club members thank you all for taking time off today to attend our AGM 2023 I would now like to call upon Sardar Harbans Singh Kalake to do the Ardaas.

**Sar. Harbans Singh (M/No.)** thank you very much for having me here as I said from the secretary Society thank you very much again.

**Hon. Secretary:** Thank you, Sar. Harbans. We are just going to observe a moment of silence for all the departed souls in the last couple of months refer to the list on page 24 let us start from now.

**Hon. Secretary:** I would now like to call upon president Parvin for the presidential address thank you.

### **Item 1. PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS**

**President:** Greetings to all members. It gives me great pleasure to welcome all members to the annual general meeting of SSU platform 2022-2024. I would like to thank all members for taking time off on a Saturday and for showing your commitment and dedication to the club.

A good 12 months have passed for the committee I am very happy to report the management committee has been working overtime together as a team to ensure that no compromises are made in service facilities and comfort of the members. The response from the members has been nothing short of remarkable; the patronage by the members has tremendously increased in all segments whether it is the food and beverage segment sporting section as well as in social and cultural segment I wish to briefly update our progress.

As for Sports Development under the watchful eye of our Sports Chairman members who attend frequently on Sundays will know that our weekends are action-packed for both parents and children. Since the commencement of our term all junior development programs have been revived and reintroduced with a brand-new look and structure now we have the football hockey netball and Cricket development programs which sees the participation of more than 100 children every Sunday the coaches engaged for the junior programs are experienced at both state and National levels. As for parents they have additional activities in store such as parent's football friendly games volleyball as well as Zumba. On the competitive level we were able to successfully host many in-house local and international events at the club premises and the outcome for team club Aman has been very promising.

Many members will know that these competitions and the clubs several successes have been covered by the press and on many social media platforms. As for membership we are pleased to inform members that the increasing sporting activities and activities generally has developed interest from many parents to either revive their membership or join the club as a member. Since May 2022 to date we have a total number of 90 new members who have joined as members, and we have kept a healthy balance of ordinary members and Associate members.

This is the breakdown; from May 2022 we have 64 ordinary and outstation members and 24 associate members who have been accepted. Currently waiting for interview are 12 ordinary members and two associate members. In a continuous effort to increase membership the committee is carefully devising an action plan to encourage

younger and more versatile individuals to join the club. As for affiliations we have managed to conclude negotiations and add the following clubs into our list of affiliated clubs. Firstly, Johor Social and Cultural Club, Singapore Khalsa Association, City University Club UK and Jodhpur Club India.

As for Club development I trust members who are patrons of the club often are aware that the club building and equipment are aging. We wish to impress upon members that the most immediate and pressing need is the roof which is entirely affected. Secondly minor repairs need to be done to the flooring in the Lion's Den. Presently we have started work on a small-scale basis in the Lion's Den to prevent further damage. We are in the midst of concreting and the process for the replacement of the full flooring in the Lion's Den.

This committee has also started in selecting club members with relevant experience to contribute towards development efforts. Hence this committee's appeal is for all members to lend their support and expertise to the club. As for social and cultural we managed to host an array of events starting with the president's ball last year and we finished off with the New Year Eve party the social and cultural team has always put together several entertainments, cultural and family events including having live entertainment every Sundays. The club is livelier from before.

As for food and beverage we have appointed a new concessionaire to take over the kitchen and the management of the kitchen and the feedback has been overwhelmingly good and they have been very receptive to the member's needs.

Our continuous plans are to ensure a scale growth of members especially younger members and to provide a better platform for youngsters to prosper whether be it in sports or health or cultural or educational activities.

Hopefully we have hosted seminars and talks to youths and have also supported many charitable courses through our CSR development programs. I now end my address by thanking the members and we are always grateful and appreciative for your continuous support. Thank you very much.

**Item 2. To read and if approved confirm the minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on Saturday the 25<sup>th</sup> May 2022 and the EGM minutes held on 13<sup>th</sup> August 2022.**

1. **President:** I agree that members have received a copy of the annual statement, minutes and statement of financial records and whatnot. Can I just put it to the house that the minutes are being read and we find the proposer and seconder, or do you wish upon us to go through the minutes?
2. All okay with that, can I have a proposer for the AGM meeting minutes held on 25th May 2022.
3. **Proposer: Dato' Rajpal Singh (M/No. 2030) Seconder: Sar. Harbans Singh Kalake (M/No.**
4. Let us have a look at the EGM minutes held on 13th August 2022 this is to discuss the Constitutional changes. Can we have a proposer and seconder from those who were present during the EGM? Those present during the EGM only.

**Proposer Dr. PS Doal (M/No. 1073)**

**Seconder is Dr. Jaspall Singh (M/No. 708)**

**Item 3. To receive, consider and approve the Annual report of the Management Committee and statement of accounts for the year ending 31<sup>st</sup> December 2022.**

5. **President:** I will hand over to the Treasurer Tuan Mender.

6. **Hon. Treasurer (Tuan Mender):** We look at the financial statements ending 31st December 2022.
7. Here is the balance sheet. Let us start off with the assets, as you can see in 2016.
8. 94 members current account is RM598,609. The explanation is provided at page three. Other receivable deposits and payments is RM170, 217 explanation is also at Page 12. Note number four Cash and Bank balances as at 31st December 2022 is RM66, 129 whereas fixed deposit placed with license Bank Maybank it was RM411, 999. So, the accumulated one explanation on 13 is RM2,809,000.32
9. This is an internal statement incoming exponential account segment for the year ended 31st December 2022. At the income total of RM1, 183,214 were received. The rest compared to 2021 is RM930,100 money so briefly I would just like to explain here and the income and the explanation expenses that in 2021 was lower exceptionally lower because of covid-19 and we had this MCO, CMCO, RMCO and then followed by the National Recovery plan. I believe everyone knows there were a lot of restrictions imposed by the government but in the year 2022 we can see the increase in income as well as also expenses is because we are undergoing or experiencing the normal charges or normal expenses as we were before for week 19.
10. So as for the major income, here I just identified here was Bar and Kitchen rental RM162,000. Entrance fees are RM16,500. I just say anything above RM10,000. Function and activities RM19,321 sponsorship. This is normally from Heineken until 2023. All rental RM28,200.
11. Now we go to expenses. AGM expenses are RM23, 724 as it was election year last year then we have a function and sponsorship of RM14,292. Licenses and permits RM34,217. These are the main expenses totalling RM105,537.
12. Now we go to page seven operating expenses. Major expenses here are of course depreciation of property plant and equipment RM271,000.44. Food Beverages and alcohol RM39, 296. This amount incurred when the club took over the food and beverage in the month of October 2022. 7th October 2022 when the former Caterers left without any notice, so we took over the food and beverage.
13. Mainly the beverage and food were provided certain times free to the members so this is the RM35,296.00 and then insurance for club is RM14,567.
14. Maintenance for buildings is RM52,435. Maintenance of electrical RM26,600. Maintenance office, field equipment RM23,531. Maintenance of equipment RM36,000 and allowances for office staff and field staff RM182,044. Security Services and internet charges is RM26,812. Water electricity charges RM150,420 so total operating expenses was RM1,047,299. Bank charges and commission is RM476, credit card charges were RM26,477 so the total expenses and DBC before taxation is RM1,183,489.
15. So this is the operating expenses on page seven the notes are provided on number nine at page 13 and the taxation on page 14 and lastly on payday is the income and expenses. On the sports so as you can see in the year 2022 the increase shows that the club is recovering and coming back to his usual side so income was RM490,792 less expenses RM192,107. So, the surplus of sports sections for the year is RM297,685 so this is uh from the audited accounts has a 31st December 2012. Are there any questions?
16. **Sar. Tejvinder Singh (M/No. 2500):** The expenses are okay now it's working all right. You did say that food beverages alcohol goes to cover so if you look at income there is no income compared to 2021 expenses. Your food beverages because you had a problem my question is you look at the alcohol sales page

30. is RM264,965. Alcohol expenses are RM267, 894. so your X alcohol expenses is high index alcohol sales.
17. **Hon. Treasurer:** During 7th of October the club took over and we had to purchase our alcohol. We had zero balance here as they took away all the stuff and nothing was left for us. We had to order so when we started and being a little bit unsure, we ordered a lot. When we ordered a lot and could not sell by 31st December 2022 the stock which we had was about RM30K or RM40. If you minus that if you minus only plus to the sales, you will see a profit margin. What happened was we had a function on 31st December 2022. In order to do that function we have to start preparing forward so not all the starters so that and then even give it a soul the entry will be made in January 2022 so in 2023 you will see the reflection that we make money from the purchase.
18. **President:** I may just add something further to whatever treasurer has informed the house earlier but previously I learned the old concessionaire agreement alcohol food beverage is a responsibility of the concessionaire society used to undertake the tasks of purchasing the stock and supplies themselves when they left on the 7th of October that is when purchase is stopped and we could not gauge what was needed in terms of running the club so we made this purchase sometime last year but definitely the balance stock only about 4.5 so we will show a healthier account maybe on the following year.
19. **Tejvinder Singh (M/No. 2500):** Number three protectionist because of ourselves but now we have the alcohol and then we buy stock we should not keep your P&L because even this sort of P&L increase and decrease in stock so next year I heard of this year if you reduce your stock to zero will show many hundred then the year after we have to print out this company so my suggestion is that all you have for balance sheets buy stock you should change the balance sheet and ask yourself you will give a better picture and my third question on this topic is since now I have been controlled by alcohol, what policies that we have implemented and what roles we have simply method to ensure that the stock balance is accurate there is no death and there is no misuse.
20. **President:** I have been having briefing with the F&B as well in terms of alcohol check and the stock check is performed every day at the end of Business by the staff. Currently since taking over this portfolio in terms of the sales of beers and alcohol we have under our three staff under the payroll of the club and no longer the caterer so we have four staff and one who is very permanently there. She performs a stock check at the end of business every day in terms of the delivery of a beer from the suppliers that the office is checking so we have our GM and our accounts clerk checking the stock on a quantified basis so thanks.
21. **Sar. Tejvinder Singh (M/No. 2500):** Just make sure someone is checking that as well but because you do not have this beer or alcohol captured as part of your inventory. The Auditors will not look at it that way so when it is captured as inventory the auditor will have to attend the stock count, they will check the balance and they will see if the stock matches what you had in the books so for me it is a good practice to improve and take over the years so we have to stop at the work.
22. I will just continue with my second question then on the other is your works is RM125 000.
23. **Hon. Treasurer:** This RM126,000 the main part is actually the amount left by Sardarji to pay the top 20 and there is a small amount of subduction to me which was borrowed by the staff here and the money has been returned in 2023. The amount due from Sardarji is RM125,570.12
24. **Tejvinder Singh (M/No. 2500):** You might have said that you still need to pay RM125,000.570 and dropping it through the block and what is the nature of this receivable?

25. **Hon. Treasurer:** Mainly from the purchase of beers because the distributor Shanghai Treasure did not want to begin with a surprise unless the club took the responsibility, so the club has to step into helping but yes he left outstanding to us so we have to pay whatever was outstanding at the time to get all of this.
26. **Tejvinder Singh (M/No. 2500):** Where is the other side of the entrance is?
27. **Hon. Treasurer:** If you are asking me that I would prefer the question to be sent to me I would attend. You are asking me now and this is just stick to nobody else definitely it is placed in these accounts because these are audited by professionals.
28. **Tejvinder Singh (M/No. 2500):** I understand but I know this one understanding things the nature of that question that if the question is of technical then you have to give me time to move into the representation whether it is 125 is recoverable and what is going to be stupid because if you have any question verses of RM5000 and you development recover this money we are doing it.
29. **President:** What transpired since last year is when they left abruptly in October last year, they cleaned up their stock and they left the club in a lurch, and we had to find a solution in terms of FNB as well as little purchases. When the committee and we assessed what is the amount owing by Sardaarji itself, we came out with a breakdown, so the breakdown comprises of number one what is owing to the supplier Shanghai Treasurer which is above RM85,000. Number two is in terms of rental and utilities which is owed in September which comes about RM24,000. Number three is the average invoice in terms of practice and activities for the months of October and November so when Sardaarji informed the committee that they do not intend to proceed in the concessionaire agreement we had a golden handshake between Sardaarji and we told them to leave by the end of November 2022. What they did was they packed up early in October 2022 so we came up with the duties of demand to Sardaarji. As it stands for the timing between the club and Sardaarji is we have entered into many talks in terms of minimizing a lot of costs.
30. They have appointed lawyers; we have appointed lawyers and our lawyers have graciously agreed to act on behalf of the club on a pro-bono basis so that is one of the cost cutting measures. which we escort as many have minutes in secure however being in the same community that ARG being Sikh and leaving a Sikh Club as well we are trying to talk to Sardaarji in order to resolve the matter in a very amicable fashion instead of looking at litigation. So currently both parties are talking, we are engaged in meetings almost every two three times.
31. Reserve this matter we have not come up with a resolution so what I have informed. I might inform the committee that if we are in a deadlock then we have to raise up the litigation so that is where it stands for the time being.
32. There is a question on the other entry. Logically payments made to Shanghai should not be in the bank balance.
33. **Sar. Tejvinder Singh (M/No. 2030)** I understand what's happening the last question that I have we are doing well 2022 is increasing of increasing expenses other than that we are still on a loss. We are still making losses despite whatever we are doing so I have two questions in this regarding what else are you doing to make the club profitable and self-sufficient yeah and number two the members sponsor also increase and their order is at the same level what you are doing so half a million and it's going up again this is so these are my last questions thank you.
34. **President:** Thank you for the questions. Just for the record because we have two categories here one is life members. Life members who are given a credit facility of one RM1,000 and when they do not pay the RM1,000 they do not be-

come defaulters. They just top up to RM300 you see at the RM1,000 is still good that is one scenario.

35. Second scenario is subscription from members who are ordinary members, associate members, lady member and outstation members. Every year subscription is charged so in other words the figure to the club is always there every year. It is up to the members to pay but club at the same time is also trying to recover the money so of course the normal methods which the club can adopt is to call out the members first of all or send an email to the member informing him of the dues then to call out the member and to tell them to pay up so just for the record the accounts are similar. Both of them are working every day to call up the members concern so in the year 2021 a sum of RM40,497 was asked to be paid back and we received this money in the year 2022 so that means they are doing their job. Then another amount in 2023 we recovered RM34,000 from the members so it is an ongoing process even for this year now. This figure is also in my mind always I also would like to reduce this figure as far as possible, but the thing is that the restriction in place and for the record also we have taken the step this year to write out those who have passed away and the amount is RM29,000.
36. We have started on this process so we take into consideration of your question your views also which are important to reply on financial interests so as far as Club activities best person to answer will be the president on how we are generating but this is a reality.
37. **Dr. Balbir Singh (M/No. 1072):** The entrance fees for Life members is five thousand so previously it was a gesture to all the members when they were looking for Life members so they gave credit of one thousand to members which is considered as illegal because life members have to pay RM5,000 as entrance fees according to the Constitution so we should not give this credit to the life members. Of course, over the years it has been difficult to collect it because we accept the precedent. Now something has to be done they have to credit one thousand dollars and then from there the process goes up. Can I have any opinion?
38. **President:** In fact, this this issue regarding this, thousands so-called credit facility given to life members have been a topic of discussion for in the last Committee as well as this committee in order to tackle this issue. I consulted the committee and we have discussed this issue but perhaps one way of looking to resolve this is by passing the byelaw whereby we will get members to regularize the RM1,000 credit facility within three months from the person on the bylaw so that is it works.
39. I will draft something out instead of looking at passing a motion or passing a resolution during a general meeting. Perhaps the way to tackle it is perhaps you know draft out the good bylaw and then members to comply. It is effective on day one within three months regularize the account so definitely the committee is looking into that thank you. For the info members information as well the entrance fee for Life Members has been raised to RM10, 000 and the credit facility is still being given. Thank you.
40. **Sar. Harbans Singh Kalake (M/No. 1162):** I have expenses say of RM400. Everybody knows that if your bill is more than one thousand unless you settle your own account. The thing is we could drop that amount to RM500 or smaller figure all what we could do is we could ask members you have a credit up to three months. In three months, you have to clear your account.
41. You know all the members could be blocked so I think that would be better rather than now we are going back and saying that I mean you know RM5, 000 and you pay RM1,000 once done so even at RM10,000 people as well so I guess this is a better step to be taken that within time frame they should pay up. Thank you.

42. **President:** The issue we are having is that anything which if we impose something like a credit facility or credit line being are given to each members every three months the task on the office becomes more because they have to monitor all these accounts now the credit facility in the beginning which has given many years ago was given as a gesture to all the life members now we see it as a problem. It is no longer adjusted because it is it has been subject to a lot of abuse so in terms of the check and balance what the committee is doing nowadays in so far as ordinary members are concerned they are not given this credit line they come in the top of their car is akin to a touching your system it can surprise members are concerned they are using the facility right up in 995 Ringgit and they are just topping up 50 ringgit to enjoy the two or three beers of the evening.
43. This abuse has been seen for a very long time so to resolve the matter of the ordinary element now our consideration defines a defaulter who has in three months so they are considered a default and subscription given away we have implemented we have upgraded the compounds now they are online with the office they have a list of the defaulters they are supposed to use their cards. Now when members come in must touch their card and enter into the premises. In the event they are defaulted they have to leave their premises so that is number one in terms of life member there is no device which we can we can implement in order to stop them coming to the club because they are enjoying the RM1,000 credit so perhaps the way to move forward with this issue is maybe we do not need to apply law we pass the bylaw to regularize your RM1,000 giving them a three-month time frame to be fair to all the life members and to be a lifetime of this club I believe that you must be standing as well and I believe that the RM1,000 should not be a problem for members. Any further questions.
44. **Sar. Tejvinder Singh (M/No. 2500):** We are still making losses. It is my full recovery here so what do we have in mind to make the club more self-sufficient we had many discussions last time as well, but we are doing better. I am not saying, and it is not easy to recover but there are things expenses who are we are still making losses and the club has to find ways to become self-sufficient and make profit.
45. **President:** There are a few sources where the income will generate by itself for the club, so I have spoken to the CSR head and subcommittee. We are looking at media companies in order to come into the club to put their advertising advertisement and through that method we are able to at least make maybe say something about RM500 to RM30,000 per annum. That is number one, number two we are looking into actually having EV charging ports in the club itself and with that it is a good facility to introduce to keep up with times and number two is that members can enjoy the EV board while the clock benefiting in terms of a commission or whatever.
46. Number three is we have also approached many companies many club members in order to put up and to make use of the Billboards which are presently in the club itself. We have several parties who have come back to us interested. We are yet to talk terms and in order to finalize those things and number four is definitely going back to the traditional method which is a fundraiser to have dinner so for example next month we are having one function on 24th June 2023. This function is dedicated to parents; this month was Mother's Day sorry Father's Day.
47. To have one function for the club member so definitely there are a lot of activities in the pipeline as the members are aware as well. We have generated a lot of income from the sporting activities itself so definitely we have installed a few interesting things, and we were looking into fundraisers in terms of where the roof is concerned as well so definitely within the next few months to probably learn something thank you.

48. **Sar. Terlochan Singh (M/no. 9457)** This is regarding on the helicopter Landings. How many landings were made last year.

49. **President:** Three. If there are there are no more questions, may we have the accounts to be passed?

**Proposer: Terlochan Singh (M/No. 9457)**

**Secunder: Tejvinder Singh (M/No. 2500)**

#### **Item 4. To appoint auditors for the year 2023**

50. We have been using Mahindar & Co for many years and who have served the club. Are there any objections from the house or you can continue using them. no objections so Mahindar & Co is appointed as the auditors for the year 2023. thank you.

#### **Item 5. To consider any other matters for which at least three (3) clear days' notice in writing has been given to the Hon. Secretary, S.S.U.**

51. **President:** We have one proposed resolution which is good by the committee members. Now this motion is proposed in relation to the Constitutional changes, and which took place on 13th of August 2022. If I may just you can see it or in a nutshell the EGM was convened on 13 August 2022 to table amendments to the Constitution. The proposed amendments introduced by the independent constitutional Review Committee were further amended and refined based on the feedback given and input presented by the members who are present. Now the changes to the Constitution the final copy is attached in the motion itself as mentioned however due to a constraint of time the proposed amended.

52. Constitution could not be submitted to ROS within a period of 60 days from the EGM therefore the resolution which is proposed is that the amendments to the SSU Constitution which was considered discussed and approved during the EGM on 13th August 2022 be adopted and submitted by the management committee within 30 to 60 days and lastly that the management committee extends its heartfelt appreciation to the ICRC comprising of Dato' Rajpal Singh, Mr Max Lall Singh, Dr. Ranjit Singh Malhi, Mr. Jasbeer Singh and Mr Harjender Singh.

53. Yesterday we had a query to the office actually with the exception of one clause 5.9. so Perhaps I just address the issue and that perhaps Dato' Rajpal can continue that plus 5.9 is slightly in conflict with Clause 5.3 whereby for Life members at the 5.3c it says here any member who has been a member of the union for a continuous period of 25 years has attained 60 years of age and is not in default shall be entitled to change this membership into a life member however in clause 5.9 it provides a clause for senior members and it was agreed that during the last meeting to do away with senior membership therefore with this exception I think the wording of senior members also appear across 3.9 and across 9.2 G so the division of the senior member will not be detrimental to the whole Constitution with this exception. Can we have this motion to be passed this morning any objections of the house?

54. **Dato' Rajpal (M/No. 2030):** Protecting your motion yes but just want to know the house if you want to keep the senior membership there because he has ongoing senior members to remove the word senior but for the ongoing senior members another easy way to just delete 5.3 C. Give me 5.3 C and remain and maintain senior member just to add a few words there then easier instead of adding so many Clauses so the senior membership remains because I do not know because there will be someone who is a senior members and he said it works is very Constitution is approved.

55. A senior member he becomes a life member and that may be an issue the next time around. I have always seen the senior member you know so would you want to consider that because that is easy available. I think that is quick sentence well because there are references to senior members throughout the constitution world so I would suggest we visit 5.3 C. Yes remove that at 5.9A like a after a member who has been a member of the union for period of exceeding 25 years and has attained the age of 60 years we need to add this work is not in default as per 5.3c not in default will be exempted from any subscription.
56. Yes include the word not in default and the rest is okay so you just give it 5.3 C and you are good to go thank you.
57. **Col. Dato' Bhupindar Singh (M/No. 262):** Yes now this amendment to the constitution has been pending for the last three years I think he started on time and then the EGM. We went through it very thoroughly we discussed at the EGM the members were interested in the amendments because we discussed it today and that close recurring senior members is a very important cross as to what is internet it should not be amended anymore because the argument there was goes back to another good reaction before that when it was presented here in the committee before the last committee and proved that a senior member would pay 30 a month a compounded interests and end of the day after 25 years to end some pain whereby that same argument regarding a senior member was paid three times more than a life member at the end of 25 years should be entitled to member and you enjoy ridiculous facilities and privileges whereas a life member who is boiling his life with blood and hope they can development.
58. I was chased out of the car park here because it was only for life membership. I say I am a senior member no it is only life members. You pay RM5,000 whereas a senior member now has paid three times more and then you chase him. I mean the whole concept of seniority in a club the whole concept of club leaders in a club has fallen down the drain. I have brought pizza before I have discussed it before currently young guys' familiar pay RM5,000 and become grandfathers of the club and they start making decisions and committee make decisions.
59. We already discuss all this and here we want to amend the same cross again thank you very much. We are not actually discussing to amend any of the clauses however we are just discussing to sign these two process so the suggestion made is to remove the senior members but the rational which you have provided for single members have served a lot for many years people will be irritating that we are not changing that but what we are doing is we are just removing that five countries see where which states that any member of the Union which has been a member for 25 years and has attained 60 years shall be entitled to change his membership to life member.
60. Now we will retain the category of the senior membership so if you have served the club for 25 years and have attained 60 years old you will be known as or you will be in the category of senior member.
61. I do not have any justification for this but this has been done for many for many years in this club we are retaining the categories so we are in the category of life membership we are retaining the category of ordinary membership associate life associated with the addition of the senior members to acknowledge the services.
62. Now you are amending that to retain life on this senior membership right.
63. We already discussed this before in the last a senior member after the 25 years is entitled to change to life membership right 3.5 now we are amending that right that means it cannot now change over to life membership.

64. We have served 35 years and attained 60 years old they will be known as senior members understand that very funny we only discussed that but the question is changing the senior membership after 25 years to write members reason because the search move Privileges and life members being put on a pedestal and the senior member is still there on the receiver member and I will give you examples where life members enjoy all sorts of privileges who is the senior member now is much worse than the young. I have used the word Chico again I use the word again on purpose because somebody did not like it.
65. Dr. Balbir Singh (M/No. 1072): Each category the senior member and a life member has his own meaningful contribution okay so there is no necessity to change the category of senior member to life right now the senior member has done its due process and that's recognized as his contribution the life member when we needed money he came into assess so there's no reason for us to change that category each person has done his own meaningful contribution.
66. **Dato' Rajpal Singh (M/No. 2030):** Thank you guys. We have passed the minutes of the egm where the amendments are done. The only reason I am asking 5.3c will be removed redundant and it completes the whole Constitution all right. I understand where Col. is coming from I will urge the committee to give equal privileges to senior members as Live members here in the future there's a parking issue can we put Senior member slash members that's the only problem if you need to pass a binary meet senior member has got it for some reason but highly Recreation a Live member put it there all right. That is what I am asking because they have been around for years right that's all they asking for recognition all right please give them the recognition thank you thank you thank you I think that is not a lot.
67. **Col. Dato' Bhupindar Singh (M/No. 262):** It is over the years mechanism recognition is one thing but end of the day the Privileges the order the way the senior members and Live members have been animated to a position where they have been given also the Privileges whether senior members have been cycling is not recognized I have given example of that we have discussed it many many times before and the amendments to the Constitution where now to to level off the playing field with the young guy who pays five thousand dollars there the senior members paid for this fifteen thousand dollars to the club and returned a lot of us before that now to level the playing field that's why the amendment there was to now allow or entitle the senior member to convert member so everybody is on the same level so now you do not discriminate between a senior member and a right member one example A life member holds the world cup.
68. I do not know foreign you get your life membership they needed the money don't say it is early days that's why the names of the board but then it's all been that in a long time ago.
69. I think my proposal is retain the last Amendment where the Clause says that the senior member itself entitled to convert his like a senior membership the language machine and you have a Level Playing Field after that that's my proposal but in terms of the Privileges being accorded to a life member and Senior member there's no discrimination it's the same number one is if let's say you are the senior members wish to have a car park together with the life members you have no issues with it I believe that the committee can decide among ourselves and that court is privileged to senior members uh however this is on the technical Point uh this is being discussed today because 5.9 and 5.3c doesn't it's not it's not reconcilable considerable because once a life member you remain as a life member and once you have a teeth uh you have to serve the club for 25 years and you are 60 years of age then you don't answer senior member now you will graduate to be a senior member in the events ordinary member for an associate but you being a life member you mean as a life member throughout your membership so I think that that's another issue it's having now is to discuss whether or not to remove 5.3 C to remove 5.3 C and

use it inclined to remain retained frequency let's put it to hope that the house decide and we can move on I think we don't need to put it to work because uh 5.3 and you see people to work that means he's saying we go senior member the whole name senior member to be removed so once you go finish your 25 years you become a life member then you have met a lot of things in this position my question is now we have two senior members do you want the remain to be known a single number you see I will tell you to remain a senior member the only issue is that what they came in and say privileges just the committee can pass a bylaw giving the same privileges to a senior member as a life member it's a small Merchant all right which was never done this committee I think will do the rightful I've got full faith in you all right to give respect to a single members right so I think we just take off 5.3 C if not it's going to be a big mess in three years this is going on I do not want you to go into fourth place just because of one Clause between senior member and life member is it so we just remove 5.3 C which has it's written to me that's all positive the important thing is when you are affiliated to a class previously when we were Afflicted to any club the light member was given dominance he was not given the privilege is not given to the ordinary member the next time we negotiate with any employment class or ordinary or senior members online members must be accorded the same privilege that is most important thank you thank you Dr Bob-by.

70. There is a further suggestion from the committee itself you know to resolve this actually perhaps we if you look at clause 5.9, we removed cross 5.3c and at 5.9 B perhaps we just amend the wordings slightly to reflect senior members are deemed to be ordinary members as associate members and enjoy similar privileges as a life member can this be done.

71. **Dato' Rajpal Singh (M/No. 2030):** Members and social members except for voting for associate member are you differentiating your own member from your life as well because to me a member of the club should have receive messages accept associate member who would be right you see you should not segregate them I think that is interesting results why a life member will come in much later suddenly has got much more privileges compared to 30 years and then becomes a senior member so you can put that if you want but then you are saying logic members the Lesser privilege that life member and senior member this is easier for you to come up with byelaves which you can always maybe then putting it into a constitution. To amend constitution you need to call for EGM again tomorrow you see so I think you will not put it you can I leave it to the house but 5.3 C has to go that is one thing what you are doing 5.9 B senior members again we already members and Associates members having privileges of a life member you want to put it there you can pass away I think the only similar factor.

72. **President:** Between the senior members and members is education and this has already been taken care of in 9.2 where subscription for Life members is name and and the senior members are exempted from any subscription so it will not cost anything you do not need to because if you go and amend 5.90 the way you say then you are segregating ordinary members understand don't do that it's not healthy for the club thank you.

73. So anyway thanks for the discussion thanks for the input uh can we just carry out this motion then everyone is agreeable the house with the amendment so the only amendment which is to be reflected on this is the deletion of 5.3C so others remain unchanged.

## **Item 6. General**

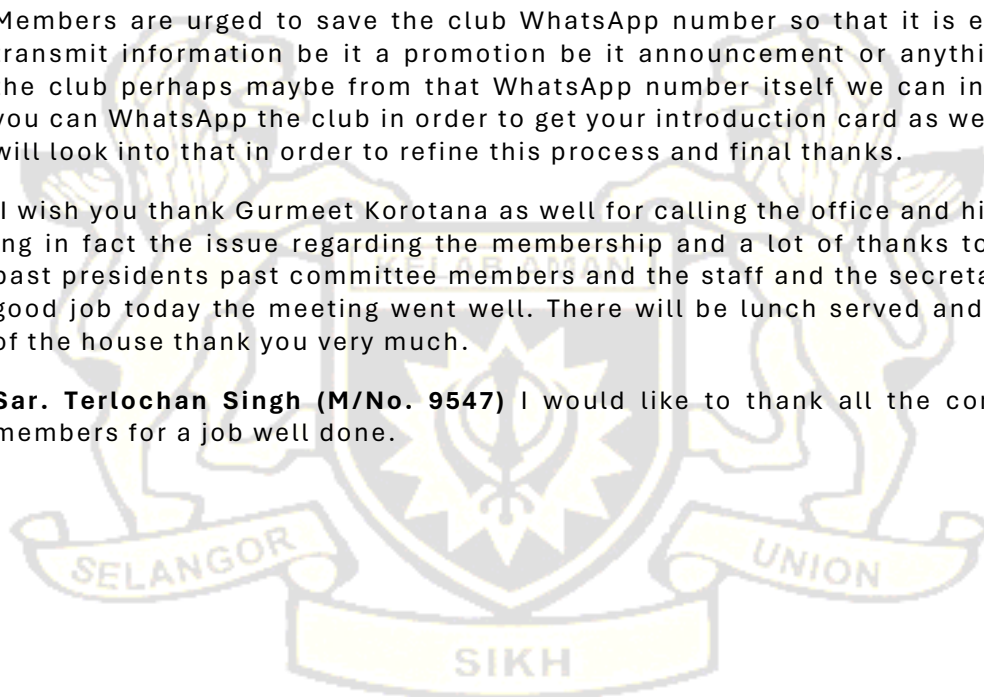
74. **President:** Now we go on to the next item general.

75. Just a matter of procedural requirement the house is unanimous to carry of the motion as identified now coming to the last item 6 General anyone wants to say anything or let me put any suggestion.

76. **Col. Dato' Bhupindar Singh (M/No. 262):** I mean you see just saying that everybody need 5.3c and all that we have already discussed in EGM and discussions but still I really think that there are other implications to connect to. You carried out the motion you propose the motion and you pass it but I am looking at it again and then I would say that you have to put it forward. Hold on before we go to the passing, we are sorry we are not over it. We are not really proposing but here the question is now also there are no issues.
77. Senior members come here okay and then in the hierarchy of the listing the membership club like apple comes first and second member comes down there so hierarchy and the similarity of the time also member comes first a lot of other minor issues.
78. **President:** Members are not here, come on the house has already decided we have carried all the motion already and we are on item number six.
79. Number two we have a small problem because outstation members are able to come and use the facilities here but the fact that you have allowed us to use the facilities in our own towns. I think that is our design of congregations to young.
80. So now the issue is when we want to go to these clubs sometimes, we cannot just go walking in just like that. We have to get permission and the permission granted is only for five days sometimes even lesser than that or even one day. I mean this is a very convenient board towards the management and your members because when we want to go it is there should be a span of two weeks so within which we can go anytime.
81. **Sar. Harbajan Singh (M/No. 2863)** So I think we should consider that permission be given for at least two weeks so that within these two weeks we feel like going we can go and there should be some flexibility in this because for us to every now and then call up and ask for permission I want to go here and there. I think and I hope that you will consider this request, it is a very simple request and then it is also convenient to both sides.
82. **President:** Thank you I believe that maybe this is something which I need to take a look at the reciprocal arrangements with these certain clubs. All these clubs have different arrangements I believe that you are familiar so we have to re-look at what is our reciprocal agreements in this club whether or not it is limited by days and by visit and then this is something very administrative and the point taken on the difficulty to secure the introduction card thanks.
83. **Sar. Lahkdip Singh (M/No. 1723)** This is just a feedback and suggestion some two weeks ago I requested for two reciprocal introduction cards one for RSUC and Royal PD Yacht club and I made this request on the 11th of May 2023 and for some reason I got for Royal Sungei Ujong Club but I did not get for Royal PD Yacht Club.
84. In the evening I went there with my dad and my family. When I went to the club they did not receive any reference from the club. We as members, who do we contact I mean this is very shameful. We should have a counter in the club to attend to our requirements.
85. We take this very seriously because it is quite shameful. Imagine office is closed on a Sunday so what do we do. I think it is very serious suggestion I hope the club will be doing something about it.
86. **President:** Very briefly I address this issue when we compare the capacity of members in terms of members can we be compared to Selangor Club. The number of members who Patron the club or the number of club members in that club are much hugely compared to us however I think this is a process which the office has got to fine tune. It is not a matter of having a reception

table in the lobby because you know sometimes it's quite inconvenient you can put the WhatsApp send to RPDYC within 10 minutes thank you.

87. **Sar. Surkhdarshan Singh (M/No. 6288):** You see how old I am. I am a life member. Can we have a staff working till 10pm. Nothing has been done now how are you going to set the club with every member. You can be better when other clubs can.
88. **Sar. Charanpal Singh (M/No. 2035):** The road opposite the management office has been in that condition for the past I do not know God knows how many donkey years. Please fix that, thank you.
89. **President:** Anything else on the floor. All right with that I would like to say if there is nothing else on the floor then I will just bring the meeting to end we wish to thank all the members for being present and thank you for your inputs but definitely we are looking to changing things. We are going to the right direction. We have introduced recently a few changes between the club itself for example if you look around the club from the registration counter we have QR codes placed in order to scan the agenda the annual report the financial report and what not and in terms of getting latest information from the club.
90. Members are urged to save the club WhatsApp number so that it is easier to transmit information be it a promotion be it announcement or anything from the club perhaps maybe from that WhatsApp number itself we can introduce you can WhatsApp the club in order to get your introduction card as well so we will look into that in order to refine this process and final thanks.
91. I wish you thank Gurmeet Korotana as well for calling the office and highlighting in fact the issue regarding the membership and a lot of thanks to all the past presidents past committee members and the staff and the secretary for a good job today the meeting went well. There will be lunch served and then id of the house thank you very much.
92. **Sar. Terlochan Singh (M/No. 9547)** I would like to thank all the committee members for a job well done.

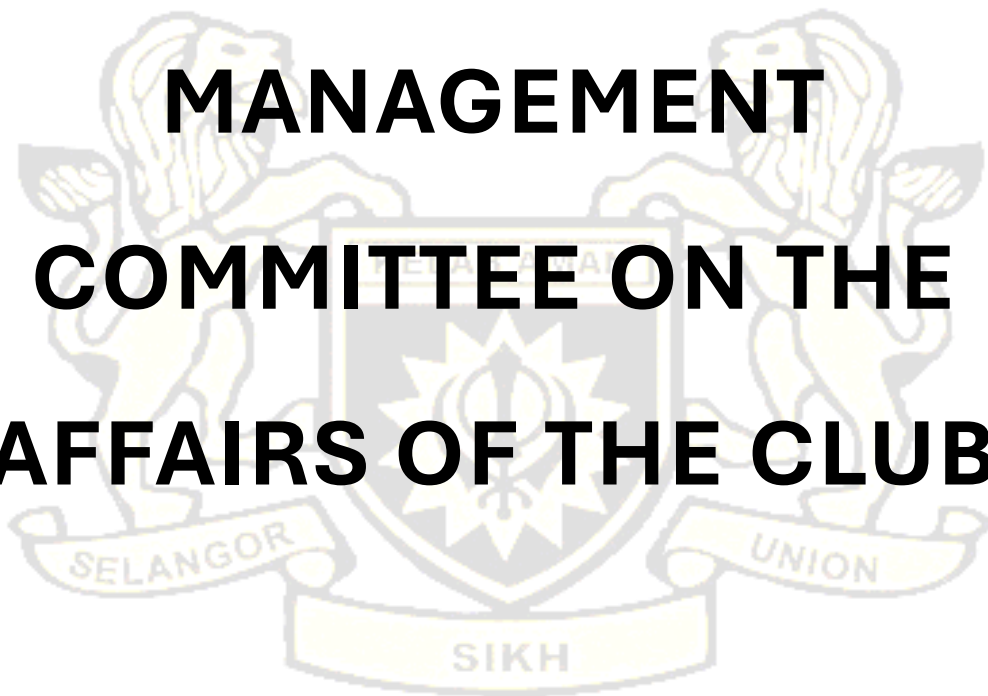

The Administrative and Staff Affairs Committee is headed by the President look into the affairs of the office and staff. Meetings are scheduled to be held to resolve operational problems and look at ways to improve efficiency for the betterment of the Club. The current three (3) staff are not sufficient to handle the workload due to the ever-increasing membership and activities. The cash and bank reconciliation are done daily to ensure there are no discrepancies.

Amendments to the constitution were made and approved by the Registrar of Societies on the **13 February 2024**.

The new system Albatross replaced the UNIWARE system. The new system is cheaper and has some good features. We have invested in a server which is the club's property. We have also introduced the Selangor Sikh Union App whereby members can do bookings, car stickers and affiliation cards. Members are also able to monitor their expenses.

## **FIELD AND COURTS**

The fields are well maintained with the club having one of the best fields around. Bookings are made and accepted via the office only. The bookings have been reduced due to the weather as no games are allowed to be played due to thunderstorms. The drainage needs to be looked into, but the committee's early assessment is that it will involve substantial costs and the field will need to be closed for some time.

Only the SSU office staff has the authority to collect payment for the facility bookings. An online booking system is being developed by the club through the SSU Kelab Aman Application. The club rule is full payment for the booking must be paid before facilities can be used.

There are regular bookings for the futsal court and hockey turf, but these are affected due to the wear and tear of the turf. The futsal and hockey turfs are in not so good a condition and rectifications need to be done by the vendor.

## **DISCIPLINE**

A Disciplinary Board has been appointed to look into cases of members who have breached SSU's code of conduct. There are less disciplinary incidents due to stringent measures and assertive actions taken. We would also advise members to adhere to the rules & code of conduct of the club.

## **COMPLIANCE**

House members consisting of Committee Members and members of the Club provide assistance to the Management Committee in maintaining discipline in the club.

A dress code is in place for the Dining Hall and Lion's Den and members are advised to adhere to the rules of the Club and SOPs in place. Action can and will be taken by the Management Committee against anyone not adhering to the club rules. Members are advised to always adhere to the club rules.

## **SECURITY**

1. The security guards work around the clock to ensure the security of the Club. Improvements have been done to the SOP of the security services by the Security Chairman and his committee. Regular meetings are held with the security company to ensure the service levels are maintained and improved.
2. Registration of non-members and guests are strictly to be done. CCTVs' have been installed at strategic locations throughout the Club to ensure security of the Club

is in top form. Members are required to adhere to the SOPs in place which includes signing of guests in the register at the guard house. Members are advised to strictly comply with the guidelines and rules of the club and sign in all their guests.

### **CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY**

An EV charger has been installed in the car park next to the Hash corner. This is for members with hybrids and EVs’.

The Cricket section organized a game in collaboration with MAKNA. It was a 2 days event. All proceeds, donations and sponsorships were given directly to MAKNA. This charity event was for cancer awareness.

### **HOUSEKEEPING AND MAINTENANCE**

1. The H&C Committee has been working diligently to keep the Club clean. We have outsourced the cleaning services, and this is for better maintenance of the Club.
2. The toilet doors in the members’ toilets have been replaced.
3. Exhaust fans have been fixed in the visitors’ toilets.
4. Our field equipment is being repaired and serviced frequently. Most of our equipment is already old and needs to be replaced and this is something that needs to be done urgently. Without proper equipment it is difficult to maintain the field which is our main source of revenue.
